- Transforming Procurement & Production As speed to market demand continues to drive pressure for quicker turnover of projects, more effective procurement, and transformational supply chain management is needed. This track will cover the actions, best practices and coaching methods that are being used to explore and solve delivery challenges and increase productivity through Lean design and construction.
- Transforming Construction Support & Planning Construction support and planning tools create better information flow and transparency.


 Together, we will discuss how utilizing tools such as visual communication, project onboarding processes, the Last Planner System ®, etc. have transformed projects and outline what obstacles these tools have helped resolve. Attendees will share how they have coached or have been coached to leverage construction support and planning tools to achieve Lean transformation.
- Transforming Field Execution & Safety Optimizing field efficiency and effectiveness through safe practices should be the number one goal of all Lean organizations. 
